Aunt Lydia's Crochet Thread, white

Anchor Stranded Cotton Embroidery Floss, yellow, golden yellow

Anchor Stitchable Felt Sheets:

3 white
1 yellow

Susan Bates Plastic Bone ring, 1-inch plastic ring

Susan Bates Embroidery Hoop, 10-inch

Fabric glue

Large-eyed tapestry needle

Scissors

Pencil

Paper clips

2 wooden or ceramic beads with ¼" openings

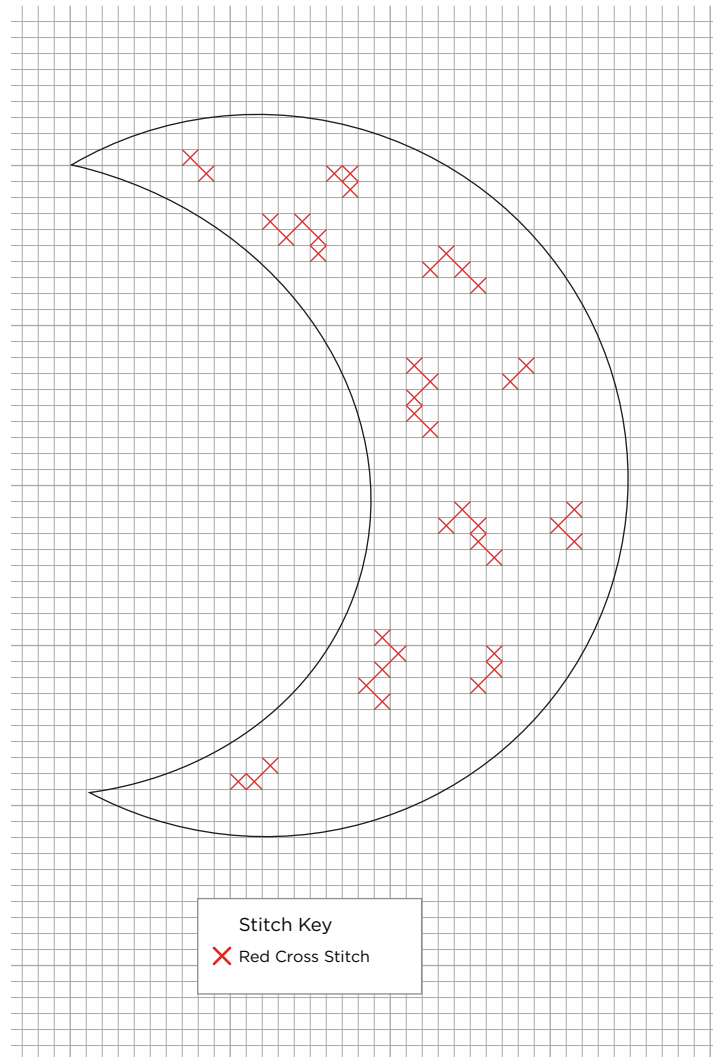
Create a whimsical star filled corner of the nursery with the Starry Night Mobile. Quick and easy to make with Anchor Stitchable Felt Sheets.

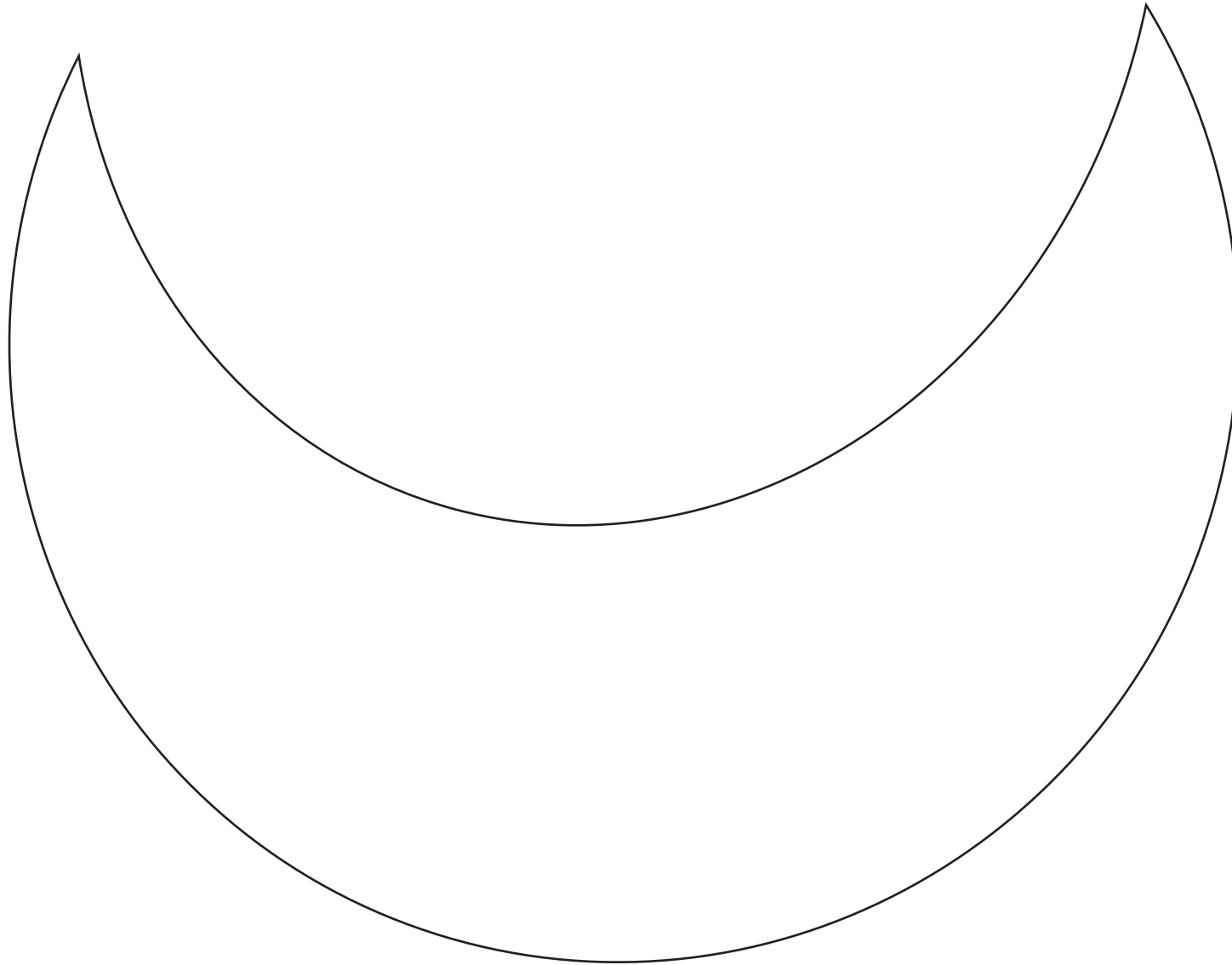
INSTRUCTIONS

1. Cut out paper star and crescent moon patterns on pages 3 - 4. Trace star shape on to Stitchable Felt. Cut 2 pieces for each star. The model has five finished stars. Cut 2 of the crescent moon pattern from yellow Stitchable Felt.
2. Use the stitch chart on page 2 for placement of the starburst cross stitch pattern. Repeat the pattern on all of the star pieces using 3 strands of embroidery floss. (For stitches with more depth use 6 strands)
3. Do random cross stitches on both sides of the crescent moon. Refer to the photo.
4. To construct the mobile cut:
(3) 48" pieces of white crochet thread
(5) 36" pieces of white crochet thread
5. Open the embroidery hoop. Fold the 3 pieces of 48" long crochet thread in half wrap around the inside hoop. Position the threads equally around the hoop. Tape in place. Pull loose ends of thread through one wooden bead. Pull bead down to 12 inches from the rim of the hoop. Hold the thread to create even tension.
6. Thread loose ends through the second wooden bead. Adjust threads so that the ends are even. Pull the ends through the plastic ring and back through the wooden bead. Tie loose ends into a knot below the wooden bead. There should be about 12 inches of cording between the wooden beads.
7. Place the crescent moon shapes over the crochet

thread. Glue moon shapes together wrong sides together with the crochet thread down the center. Use paper clips to hold pieces together until glue is set.

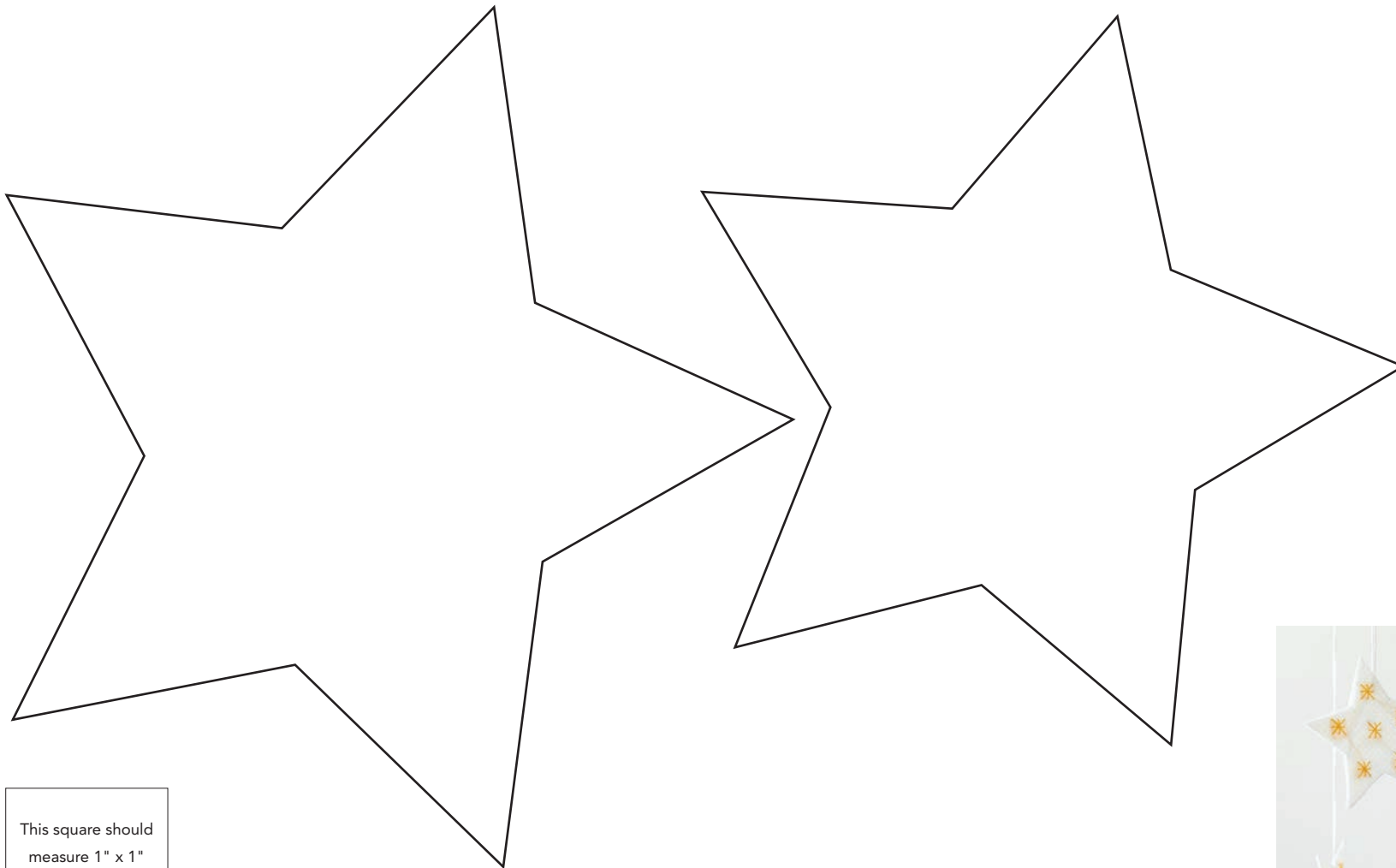
8. Fold 36" pieces of white crochet thread in half. Place over the embroidery hoop. Space threads evenly around hoop. Tie the thread underneath the hoop. Let threads hang from the hoop. Place embroidered stars wrong sides together over the thread at various lengths. Refer to the model. Glue stars together with the crochet thread down the center of the star. Paper clip sides until glue is set.
9. Once the glue has set, trim excess crochet thread even with the edge of the stars.
10. To secure all threads slowly lower the outside of the embroidery hoop in place. Tighten.
