



In "Maintaining Pacing"

Make sure the user only has one task to perform at once.

Limit the number of choices the user has at any one time.

Only give the user meaningful choices.

Make sure the user knows what to do at any one time.





Phone conversation: 1 (hard to ignore).

### Contextual sociability

Email: Excellent filtering.

Phonebook: Simple screening (caller-ID).

IM: Good filtering (status, invisbility, caller-ID).





### Privacy is:

hard to explain on the web of data. high priority for everyone - make it simple.

### Login boxes

Login boxes break frame: they snap you out of flow. Snap users back into flow as fast as possible. How much should be visible to non-logged in users? It's impolite to keep safe things secret.

# NB: Exchanging username and password changes the relationship a user has with anything.
