Survey of N=1,228 voters in the Likely Electorate nationally, plus voters in the Likely Electorate in the following states: Arizona (N=773), Arkansas (N=382), Florida (N=815), Georgia (N=751), Kansas (N=392), Louisiana (N=506), Montana (N=320), Mississippi (N=409), Ohio (N=831), Oklahoma (N=522), Pennsylvania (N=828), Rhode Island (N=373), South Carolina (N=600), and Texas (N=813)

Field Dates: August 31 -September 7, 2022

METHODOLOGY

N = 1,228 Registered Voters were surveyed nationally from August 31 - September 7, 2022. Surveys were also conducted in the following states: Arizona (N=773), Arkansas (N=382), Florida (N=815), Georgia (N=751), Kansas (N=392), Louisiana (N=506), Montana (N=320), Mississippi (N=409), Ohio (N=831), Oklahoma (N=522), Pennsylvania (N=828), Rhode Island (N=373), South Carolina (N=600), and Texas (N=813). Respondents were sampled via web panel and matched to the voter file (except for Montana and Rhode Island).

The national and statewide samples were separately weighted to population benchmarks for 2022 Likely Electorate on gender, age, race/ethnicity, education, and 2020 vote. State samples were also weighted on DMA. All benchmarks for the 2022 Likely Electorate were adjusted for turnout estimates based on a probabilistic model of the likely 2022 midterm electorate derived from the L2 voter file. Estimates for gender, age, and party, were derived from the L2 voter file. Estimates for race/ethnicity and education were derived from the US Census Bureau's American Community Survey demographic data adjusted to match voter registration estimates from the November 2020 Current Population Survey Voting and Registration Supplement.

Data quality measures included measures to prevent and remove duplicate responses based on IP address and voter file matches.

The margin of error is calculated the way it would be for a random sample and adjusted to incorporate the effect of weighting is ± 3.5 percentage points, nationally. Statewide margins of error are as follows: Arizona ± 4.5 , Arkansas ± 7.7 , Florida ± 4.3 , Georgia ± 4.4 , Kansas ± 7.5 , Louisiana ± 6.5 , Montana ± 6.6 , Mississippi ± 7.8 , Ohio ± 4.3 , Oklahoma ± 6.3 , Pennsylvania ± 4.1 , Rhode Island ± 6.1 , South Carolina ± 5.1 , and Texas ± 4.4 .
